#### *Here's a bit of local history:*

From the 1850's when local cattle herds began to grow, through the cattle wars of the 1860's and 1870's, cattle ruled. Hogs, too. They roamed unfenced in this part of the state, free to trample yards and eat gardens. Homeowners were obliged to fence their property to keep them out. The school was likewise fenced for the same reason, as was the church. They became a nuisance on railroad tracks and in the streets, also. In spite of public opinion, cattle and hogs continued to run free until 1949 when legislation was passed at last. The cattle industry had to begin the expensive proposition of fencing their herds and dipping the cattle for ticks. The free-range era of cattle ranching was over, also making it possible to control and improve the herds.





#### **PROGRAMS**


